

Figure 3. JS - WR by Regional Council (total)






Figure 5. JS – WR by Regional Council - NZ European



#### Figure 7. Population proportion of 18-64 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support, by Regional Council



#### Figure 9. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by ethnicity




#### Figure 10. Jobseeker Support, by gender




#### Figure 11. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by age groups




Figure 14. Hardship assistance
