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Welfare Overhaul: Update on Progress and Long-Term Plan

Portfolio Social Development

On 6 November 2019, the Cabinet Social Wellbeing Committee (SWC):

- 1 **noted** that on 9 May 2018, SWC noted that the Welfare Expert Advisory Group will contribute to realising the government's vision for the welfare system, which is to ensure people:
 - 1.1 have an adequate income and standard of living;
 - 1.2 are treated with and can live in dignity;
 - 1.3 are able to participate meaningfully in their communities;

- 2 **noted** that on 15 April 2019, Cabinet agreed, in response to the recommendations of the Welfare Expert Advisory Group, to three priority areas in which to undertake immediate work:
 - 2.1 addressing financial support with a focus on child wellbeing;
 - 2.2 supporting people who are able to be earning, learning, caring and volunteering;
 - 2.3 improving access to affordable housing;

- 3 **noted** that on 15 April 2019, Cabinet invited the Minister for Social Development to report back to SWC later in 2019 with an update on the priority areas for action and policy development, as well as a long-term comprehensive work programme [CAB-19-MIN-0170];
- 4 **endorsed** the proposed key features of the future state of the welfare system:
 - 4.1 underpinned by values relevant for New Zealand;
 - 4.2 enables individuals, families and whānau to thrive;
 - 4.3 adequately supports employment and training;
 - 4.4 recognises the value of unpaid work, such as caring and volunteering;
 - 4.5 takes a whole-of-community approach to working with partners;

- 6 endorsed the proposed short-term work programme, which will include work focused on:
 - 6.1 reducing barriers to employment and training;
 - 6.2 better support for parents;
 - 6.3 ensuring income support is accessible;
 - 6.4 better support for disabled people and people with health conditions;
- 7 **endorsed** the proposed medium-term work programme, which will include work focused on:
 - 7.1 resetting the foundations of the welfare system;
 - 7.2 increasing income support and addressing debt;
 - 7.3 improving and expanding employment services;
 - 7.4 improving supports and services for disabled people, people with health conditions and disabilities and their carers;
 - 7.5 enhancing the community sector;
- 8 endorsed the proposed long-term work programme, which will include work focused on:
 - 8.1 simplifying the income support system;
 - 8.2 aligning the welfare system with other support systems;
 - 8.3 reviewing housing and childcare supports;
- 9 invited the Minister for Social Development to report-back to SWC with an engagement plan for the welfare overhaul work programme in early 2020;
- 10 **noted** that alongside the Welfare Overhaul, the Ministry for Social Development is developing the Te Pae Tawhiti investment case to help guide long-term investment and planning.
