
STUDENT SUPPORT UPDATE – JANUARY TO SEPTEMBER 2021


Snapshot – January to September 2021

A total of 160,728 students received student support, an increase of 1.8 percent compared to same period last year


144,705 students borrowed under the Student Loan (SL) Scheme













The number of SA recipients and amount paid increased




Average Student Allowance paid




