On 6 March 2018, you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, information regarding state housing. On 8 March 2018 you were emailed links that responded to several of your questions and you refined your request. For clarity your questions are responded to in turn.

 How many families with four or more children are on the social housing register? Please break this into ethnicity and area.

The table below shows the number of applications on the Social Housing Register and the Transfer Register where the number of children is specified as four or more as at 31 December 2017, broken down by region and ethnicity.

 Reporting of ethnicity is voluntary and is based on the prioritised self reported ethnicity of the main applicant.

• Finally, what consultation will there be with Maori and Pasifika over new

developments of state housing?

I understand that Housing New Zealand will be responding to you with regards to your latter two questions, as this information is more directly related to Housing New Zealand's responsibility.

You should note that the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment is the lead agency for Kiwibuild and any information provided to the Minister will be held by that agency.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

 to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,

• to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and

• to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter available to the wider public shortly. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
