On 26 June 2018, you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

- A copy of the May public housing waitlist figures, for both the waitlist and the transfer list. No breakdown into priorities is necessary.
- I understand these might not have been compiled into a register form yet. A raw figure for the end of the month would be adequate.

The following table shows the number of applicants on the Social Housing Register as at the end of May 2018 broken down by register type.

Register Type	Number of Applicants
Housing Register	8,519
Transfer Register	1,849
Total	10,368

Notes:

- This only includes clients from the A and B priorities
- The Social Housing register is the Housing Register and the Transfer Register

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.
