



On 5 September 2019 and 16 September 2019, you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

- *A list of all IT/computer related jobs that have been registered through WINZ Porirua (for job seekers) since 2017 - year by year and their titles please.*
- *All IT related jobs registered with WINZ Porirua for each of the respective years 2017,2018 and 2019.*

A total of 10 IT positions were registered with the Porirua Community Link between 1 April 2017 and 30 June 2019. I can confirm that of these 10 IT positions, six positions were registered in 2017 and four positions in 2018.

I can advise that of the 10 IT positions, five were titled Computer Technician Junior and one each were titled IT Support Person, Computer Systems Engineer, IT Technician Security, Help Desk Operator IT and Computer Software Developer.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public shortly. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
