Please note that we have not provided pay details for individual Work Brokers in order to protect the privacy of Ministry employees under section 9(2)(a) of the Privacy Act 2020.

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.
