






Population proportion of 15-64 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support, by Regional Council










West Coast 7.9% Population proportion, and percentage












Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by Regional Council and ethnicity














Special Needs Grants granted for food, by Regional Council




Special Needs Grants granted for food, by ethnicity









CIRP recipients, by gender




CIRP recipients, by ethnicity




CIRP recipients, by relationship status
