















COVID-19 Income Relief Payment (CIRP)

① From 8 July 2020, people who lost their job between 1 March 2020 and 30 October 2020 can apply for CIRP and receive payments for up to 12 weeks. Numbers reported are of those eligible, aged 16 and older.



10,925 grants * for CIRP granted during July 2020, compared with 12,589 during June 2020. A 736 transfers ** from Jobseeker Support to CIRP occurred during July 2020, compared with 2,624 during June 2020.	 1,029 cancels* for CIRP during July 2020, compared with 307 during June 2020. A 61.9 percent of cancels during July 2020 were due to obtaining work, while 6.7 percent were due to transferring to another benefit. 	20,957 recipients *** supported by CIRP, compared with 10,579 as at the end of June 2020. A 2,886 recipients transferred from Jobseeker Support to CIRP, compared with 2,352 as at the end of June 2020.	

* CIRP grants can subsequently be suspended or cancelled if the recipient gains employment or a grant was applied incorrectly. This means total grants over time will not add up to the number of CIRP recipients. CIRP cancels can occur due to the recipient obtaining work, being transferred to another benefit, and other reasons.

** Transfers to CIRP from Jobseeker Support are cumulative counts of people granted CIRP, who were recently in receipt (or the partner of a primary recipient) of Jobseeker Support.



CIRP recipients by gender



CIRP recipients by ethnicity




CIRP recipients by relationship status




