Figure 1. Main benefit categories and sub-categories




Figure 2. All main benefits, timeseries





Figure 3. Other main benefits

Figure 4. Population proportion of 18-64 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support, by Regional Council







Figure 7. JS - WR by Regional





Figure 10. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by ethnicity




Figure 11. Jobseeker Support, by gender






Figure 12. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by age groups




Figure 15. Hardship assistance
