Figure 1. Main benefit categories and sub-categories






Figure 2. All main benefits, timeseries

Figure 3. JS - WR by Regional Council (total)




Figure 5. JS - WR by Regional Council - NZ European




Figure 6. JS - WR by Regional Council - Pacific peoples





Figure 8. Population proportion, and percentage point change,

Figure 9. Jobseeker Support – Work Ready, by ethnicity





Figure 10. Jobseeker Support, by gender








Figure 11. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by age groups




Figure 14. Hardship assistance
