Figure 1. Main benefit categories and sub-categories





Figure 2. All main benefits, timeseries








Figure 7. Population proportion of 18-64 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support, by Regional Council





Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by Regional Council and ethnicity

Figure 3. JS - WR by Regional Council (total)














Figure 9. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by ethnicity




Figure 10. Jobseeker Support, by gender






Figure 11. Jobseeker Support - Work Ready, by age groups




Figure 14. Hardship assistance
