

Continuing Family Violence Response Coordination services

The Government has allocated \$6 million to extend Family Violence Response Coordination services for two years.

Wellbeing Budget 2022

This initiative is part of a whole-of-government Joint Venture package of \$114.52 million over four years to prevent and respond to family violence and sexual violence.

Family Violence Response Coordination network contracts across Aotearoa New Zealand are being extended for two years.

This initiative is part of a wider Joint Venture agency initiative that supports and expands Integrated Community-led Responses.

- Family Violence Response Coordinators strengthen their local communities by improving inter-agency coordination, collaboration, and communication.
 - This funding will ensure continuity of current service provision and retain the knowledge and expertise of the Family Violence Response Coordinators, which will be needed as Integrated Community-led Response initiatives are expanded.
 - Integrated Community-led Response initiatives seek to support and enhance community-based responses to family violence, so that communities can create long-term, sustainable change.
 - Family Violence Response Coordinators will be a part of building regional infrastructure to support an Integrated Community Response to family violence.
 - These Coordinators will also be instrumental in transitioning Regional Practice Leads into their roles within local communities.
- This initiative supports the delivery of Action 2 of Te Aorerekura Action Plan: Agencies integrate community-led responses.
 - It will contribute to the following system impacts:
 - Government and communities work better together
 - Communities design, lead and deliver solutions to affect change
 - Joined up and easier to navigate services.
 - As part of Integrated Community-led Responses, this initiative will help more people, families and whānau affected by family violence access integrated and inclusive responses to keep them safe.
