Expansion of the Flexi-Wage Scheme

30 November 2020, Cabinet paper - Expansion of Flexi-Wage to support 40,000 New Zealanders into work or to start their own business.

This information sets out the proposed changes for expanding Flexi-Wage to support up to an additional 40,000 New Zealanders into work or to start their own business. Cabinet agreed to:

- introducing the ability to target key cohorts (for example, people disadvantaged in the labour market, sectors most affected by COVID-19; and people who are under-utilised in certain circumstances)
- making it easier for employers to navigate and understand Flexi Wage by increasing certainty and consistency in how much they will receive through streamlining the Flexi-Wage, introducing set rates, while also maintaining flexibility through a discretionary band
- undertaking a multi-pronged, multi-year media campaign to promote the support available and utilise what we know about good employers and sustainable employment.

These changes are set to be completed in a phased approach that enables MSD to support more people into work while also building capacity to meet forecasted increases in unemployment. The paper also sets out the ring-fenced \$30 million to expand Flexi-Wage Self-Employment.
