As it happens, I've just had an answer this afternoon, both on timelines and select committee process:

"There aren't TSY timelines that would constrain them around Budget Night Legislation as it's determined by the Leader of the House on what legislation is presented on Budget Night. I think the only thing is that if the legislation has fiscals related, then the Cabinet paper should not be introduced during Budget moratorium.

"Not sure on the second point, it's up to the Minister introducing the legislation what process she wants to go through as far as we are aware, they can just do the first reading then refer it to Select Committee on Budget night. This all depends on whether it is introduced and the time available on Budget Night."

Hopefully that's helpful, even if not definitive.

When we met you agreed to ask your colleagues if a Bill is introduced as part of the Budge legislation package could then go on a non-budget night legislation track. However, I found a Treasury example which might be useful to reference when asking your colleagues about Budget legislation that goes on to another legislative truncated process. According to the Cabinet paper released – the Bill was proposed to be introduced on Budget Day and be passed by early 2026. It was also referred to a select committee.
