This joint Cabinet paper seeks agreement to further reprioritise funds from Vote Education's Outcomes for Target Student Groups MCA and draw down funds from the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund, to meet ongoing increased community need for food access and other essential wellbeing items in response to the emergence of the COVID-19 Delta variant – covering the two week period from 11 September 2021.

Some parts of this information release would not be appropriate to release and, if requested, would be withheld under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). Where this is the case, the relevant sections of the Act that would apply have been identified. Where information has been withheld, no public interest has been identified that would outweigh the reasons for withholding it. This is the key to the redaction codes used for this release:

- Section 9(2)(f)(iv) the confidentiality of advice under active consideration
- Section 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinion
- Section 9(2)(j) to avoid prejudice to negotiations.

Please note – The Cabinet paper had a typographical error in paragraph 2 and 51: it should say 'Community Capability and Resilience Fund' rather than 'Community Resilience and Recovery Fund'. There is also a typographical error in paragraph 53: it references the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund (CRRF), when it should reference the Community Capability and Resilience Fund (CCRF). This does not have a substantive change on the assessed impact and cost of the policy.

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
