#### Regional leadership

- Regions will determine best group and/or membership to provide oversight.
- Each region has a DHB and resurgence

#### Local assessment and allocation

- · Needs to align with the clinical and public health assessment.
- Located where region determines it makes sense (e.g. agency, community, iwi)
- Needs to leverage existing MSD and other agencies services and infrastructure.
- Based on modelling to determine regional need and at risk population groups.

### **Delivery of** welfare support

- · This model assumes delivery occurs through existing BAU - MSD case managers, other agencies, community providers, iwi and hāpu.
- Needs to align with the clinical and health patient pathway and housing supports.




