Updated Cabinet Papers: Changes to welfare settings to support people into employment and off benefit

Purpose of the report

- 1 To provide you with an updated version of your draft Cabinet papers, following consultation:
 - 1.1 Changes to Welfare Settings to Support People Into Employment and Off Benefit: Traffic Light System
 - 1.2 Changes to Welfare Settings to Support People Into Employment and Off Benefit: 26-week reapplications.

Key points

- 2 Drafts of these Cabinet papers were circulated for Ministerial, Cross-party and Departmental agency consultation on Wednesday 24 July 2024.
- 3 The Ministry of Social Development received feedback from various government agencies covering topics including:
 - inclusion of more information on some proposals
 - potential risks and negative impacts, including the flow-on to other parts of government
 - population implications that should be included or highlighted.
- 4 We have made changes to the attached draft Cabinet papers to address some of this feedback, for your consideration.

- 5 Changes made to both papers include:
 - addition of population implications for older people (aged 50 to 64 years) and children and young people
 - highlighting the potential downstream costs to other parts of government associated with the proposals – e.g. where people exit benefit and go into education
 - link to MSD's Te Pae Tawhiti Programme, with a specific reference that you expect to provide an update on this in the coming months
 - changes for clarity.
- 6 Changes that have been made to *Changes to Welfare Settings to Support People Into Employment and Off Benefit: Traffic Light System* include:
 - clarifying that for Money Management having 50 percent of benefit going on a payment card means that they can only use this at some retailers for essential items
 - clarifying that Community Work Experience is unpaid
 - changes to the population implications section particularly for women and disabled people to call out the impacts more specifically.
- 7 Changes that have been made to Changes to *Welfare Settings to Support People Into Employment and Off Benefit: 26-week reapplications* include:
 - adding a recommendation that seeks agreement for savings to be managed as a positive charge against the Budget 2025 operating allowance
 - addition of a new table that compares the components of 52-week reapplications and 26-week reapplications
 - updating the figures that show the process for regrant and expiry to show both the client and MSD parts of the process
 - clarifying the interaction between the Korero Mahi Work Check-ins and the 26-week reapplication.
- 8 Some feedback was beyond the scope of the proposals of the paper, including:
 - to describe the wider landscape of employment supports that could help achieve the target
 - to attach or provide a high-level outline of the delivery plan for the target
 - matters that relate more to the implementation of the proposals or the monitoring and evaluation of them – we will take these into account in future work.

- 9 Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora noted that the Cabinet papers and RIS acknowledge that Māori will be disproportionately affected from the proposals, including with regard to health outcomes. They advised that this may in turn have a negative impact on their ability to deliver on the health sector principles within the Pae Ora Act.
- 10 We have also attached the Regulatory Impact Statement which has been finalised.
- 11 We are working with your office to finalise the Communications section in line with your preferences.
