The Ministry provides the National Beneficiaries Advocacy Consultative Group with the quarterly reports listed above which shows data regarding clients with an apparent eligibility to Temporatry Additional Support (TAS) based on the accommodation and disability related costs recorded on their file, and of those, who are not in receipt of TAS.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- · to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter available to the wider public shortly. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
