On 30 January 2017 you emailed the Ministry requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, information regarding vehicles the Ministry owns or leases. For the sake of clarity I will address each of your questions in turn.

The Ministry employs almost 10,000 staff who work at more than 290 locations in New Zealand. Child, Youth and Family Social Workers travel extensively, sometimes to very remote areas, and it is essential that they have access to safe and reliable transport. As such it is necessary that the Ministry maintain a fleet of vehicles, which numbered 1,192 as of 30 January 2017. The Ministry owns all the vehicles in its fleet.

To ensure front line staff have access to fit for purpose vehicles, the Ministry aims to replace passenger vehicles at four years or at 100,000 kilometres, and light commercial vehicles at 6 years or at 120,000 kilometres, funding permitting.

- How many motor vehicles by type (eg car, van, ute, truck, etc.) were owned or leased as of 30 January 2017?
- How many motor vehicles by type (eg car, van, ute, truck, etc.) are powered by petrol, diesel, LPG/CNG, electricity, hydrogen, hybrid or other (please specify) as of 30 January 2017?
- What is the average age of your vehicles by type as of 30 January 2017?

Table 1: The number of vehicles the Ministry owns, categorised by vehicle type, broken down by fuel type and average age, as at 30 January 2017.

 - Vans include Minibuses, seating 8, 10 and 12 people, and cargo vans, of which the Ministry owns two.
 - The Ministry does not currently own any electric/hybrid vehicles.

 How many vehicles were acquired or/or leased since November 2008, broken down by year?

 How many vehicles were disposed of and/or had leases terminated on an annual basis, and what were the monies realised (or in the case of leases, incurred) since November 2008, broken down by year?

Please note, the above figures for 2016/17 show the acquisitions and disposals as at 30 January 2017. The Ministry intends to replace a further 63 vehicles by 30 June 2017.

• What are (or have been) the annual running costs as well as lease costs (if applicable) by vehicle type (eg car, van, ute, truck, etc.) since November 2008, broken down by year?

The Ministry does not record running cost by vehicle type, and to provide this information would require Ministry staff to manually review tens of thousands of vehicle expense claims from every year since 2008/09 and categorise them by vehicle type. As such this information is refused under section 18(f) of the Official Information Act, as substantial manual collation would be required.

I have considered whether the Ministry would be able to respond to your request given extra time, or the ability to charge for the information requested. I have concluded that, in either case, the Ministry's ability to undertake its work would still be prejudiced.

Note:

 Running costs include repairs, maintenance, fuel, insurance premiums and claims excess and/or repairs, registration costs, Road User Charges and car park leases. Depreciation, capital charge and fringe benefit tax is not included.
