



Thank you for your email of 20 August 2019 requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982, the following information:

• The number and type of sanctions that have been imposed on benefits from January 2017 to date, broken down by region and quarter.

As you are aware, a sanction is imposed on a benefit when a client has not fulfilled their obligations. Over the last five years there has been an overall decline in the number of sanctions issued, particularly sanctions imposed where clients have not fulfilled their work-related obligations.

The Ministry publishes data relating to sanctions on a quarterly basis, including the number of sanctions imposed, broken down by Work and Income region. This information is available at: www.msd.govt.nz/about-msd-and-our-work/publications-resources/statistics/benefit/latest-quarterly-results/benefit-sanctions.html.

There are three types of sanctions: graduated (percentage reduction in benefit amount), suspended and cancelled. Sanctions can affect benefit recipients in a number of ways depending on their circumstances and the number of times they have had a sanction imposed over the last 12 months. Not everyone who does not meet their obligations will be sanctioned. A sanction can be withdrawn when a client re-complies or provides additional information.

Please find enclosed a table showing the number and type of sanctions imposed on benefits for the period 1 March 2017 to 30 June 2019, broken down by region and quarter.

Please note, in order to protect client privacy, some values are suppressed and are represented by 'S'. The Ministry is unable to provide you with the exact number as releasing this information is likely to risk identifying the individuals concerned. As such, this information is withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act. The need to protect the privacy of these individuals outweighs and public interest in the information.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

The Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public shortly. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.

- Graduated and Rate Reduction sanctions are where a client's benefit has been reduced, normally by 50%.
- The table includes working age people only (aged 18 to 64 years).
- Main Benefits exclude NZ Superannuation, Veteran's Pension, Non-Beneficiary assistance, Orphan's Benefit and Unsupported Child's Benefit.
- The 'Other' region includes clients managed from non-regional service centres such as the Centralised Unit Housing service centre and Studylink Processing Centre.
- This is a report counting sanctions not clients. Clients may have had more than one sanction.
- Some records have been suppressed with an "S" to protect client privacy.
