### Tēnā koe

On 18 November 2020, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- How many Porirua people received Jobseeker at as the end of the March, June, Sept and Dec quarters 2019 and the March, June, Sept quarters 2020?
- How many Porirua people received TAS/Special benefit at the end of the Sept quarter 2019 and Sept quarter 2020?
- How many Porirua people received SNG for food at the end of the Sept quarter 2019 and Sept quarter 2020?
- How many Porirua people received Hardship Assistance (SNG, ADV and RAPs) at the end of the Sept quarter 2019 and Sept quarter 2020?

Also, on 26 November 2020, you emailed the Ministry requesting the following additional information under the Act:

 How many people aged 18-24 years received Jobseeker benefit in Porirua for the quarters ending March, June, September and December 2019, and March, June and September 2020?

All of your requests will be addressed in this single response.

Please note that the year 2020 has seen a significant increase in demand for Government assistance as the Ministry has supported people through the COVID-19 pandemic period. This should be taken into account when comparing it with data from previous quarters.

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- · to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
