On 2 September 2020, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

 The definition of 'revenue' used by the Ministry in the context of COVID-19 Wage Subsidy applications.

For the purposes of determining a decline in revenue when applying for the COVID-19 Wage Subsidy, the Ministry defines revenue as the total amount of money a business has earned from its normal activities before expenses are deducted. The Ministry defines revenue broadly to allow businesses to determine the method for calculation that reflects their usual practice.

This definition reiterates that the COVID-19 Wage Subsidy ran on a high-trust model with payments made to applicants as quickly as possible to ensure support for those suffering the immediate economic impacts of COVID-19.

It should be noted that applications for the COVID-19 Wage Subsidy and Wage Subsidy Extension closed on 3 September 2020.

The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry of Social Development's website.
