## Tēnā koe

On 4 May 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

- How many people are currently in emergency housing motels in New Zealand, broken down by region and age?
- How many people between the age of 16-24 are currently in emergency housing motels, broken down by region?
- How many people under the age of 24 are currently in emergency housing motels, broken down by region?
- How many people under the age of 18 are currently in emergency housing motels, broken down by region?

The Emergency Housing Special Needs Grant (EH SNG) is available to people who cannot remain in their usual place of residence, if any, and do not have access to other accommodation which is adequate for them or their family's needs. The Ministry pays EH SNGs directly to the accommodation supplier and assistance is generally granted for up to seven nights but can be extended dependant on individual circumstances.

The Ministry recognises that motels are not a long-term solution or the solution that we want to deliver for people who are potentially in a vulnerable situation. They provide a short-term solution while more sustainable options are progressed. More information about EH SNGs is available at the following link:

The Ministry provides and administers financial assistance for young clients between the ages of 16 and 19 through the Youth Service. As part of this service, clients are supported with services such as Youth Payments and Youth Coaching, as well as being provided with support and information about housing support such as emergency housing, transitional housing, and public housing programmes. The Ministry only considers emergency housing for young clients after assessing other options, such as staying with family or friends, or helping with rental payments through hardship assistance. While young clients are in emergency housing, the Ministry continues their support and acts to help the client find longer-term housing options. Regarding your first three questions, please find **Table One** within **Appendix A** attached, which discusses clients with Emergency Housing Special Needs Grants in the quarter ending March 2021, broken down by territorial authority and age group.

Regarding your fourth question, please find **Table Two** within **Appendix A** attached, which discusses clients with Emergency Housing Special Needs Grants in the quarter ending March 2021, broken down by territorial authority and age group (including under 18).

The Ministry has interpreted your request as one for data from all emergency housing accommodation suppliers, not just motels. If this was not the intent of your request, please feel free to contact us.

Please note that the data provided refers to the number of distinct clients that received an EH SNG. A distinct client may not necessarily represent one person. EH SNGs to distinct clients could be to accommodate a household which could represent one person or more.

In order to protect client privacy, some values are suppressed and are represented by 'S'. The Ministry is unable to provide you with the exact number as releasing this information is likely to risk identifying the individuals concerned. As such, this information is withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act. The need to protect the privacy of these individuals outweighs any public interest in the information.

The principles and purposes of the Act under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- · to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter and attachments on the Ministry of Social Development's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.

Notes for Tables One and Two:

- This is a count of distinct clients. Clients may receive more than one grant in a period.
- Clients can be counted in more than one territorial authority if they have had grants in multiple territorial authorities.
- Clients may also be counted in more than one age group if they have had
  a birthday during the period. For this reason, the sum of distinct clients by
  territorial authority or age group may be different from the total distinct
  clients.
- Territorial authority is based on the clients address as at the time of the grant and may not be reflective of where their emergency housing is located.
- Ungeocoded address records that are unable to be matched to a territorial authority through suburb and city details have an unknown territorial authority.
- To protect confidentiality the Ministry uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- A value of one or two may be rounded to zero or three.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
- In certain circumstances low numbers may potentially lead to individuals being identified.
- Due to these privacy concerns, numbers for some categories of clients have been suppressed or aggregated.
- Secondary suppression rules have also been applied when required.
   Suppressed numbers have been replaced by an 'S'.
