On 4 May 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information relating to young people currently on Jobseeker Support:

- 1. Area of Focus: WBOP District Council Katikati-Waihi Beach Ward, extending from Pahoia to Waihi Beach, with the Waipapa River being the Southern boundary.
- 2. Data Required: Jobseeker Support numbers for 16-24 year olds. (Subset of Males & Females would be helpful)
- 3. Data Frequency: Monthly
- 4. Data Period: January 2019 Latest Available (March 2021 appears to be online currently)
- 5. Other: We would like to be able to continue to receive this data each month as it becomes available if that is feasible.

Please see **Table One** below, which outlines the total number of 18-24 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support in the Western Bay of Plenty Territorial Land Authority (TLA) between January 2019 and March 2021, broken down by month and gender.

**Table One**: The total number of working age clients 18-24 year olds receiving Jobseeker Support in the Western Bay of Plenty TLA as at the end of each month between January 2019 and March 2021, broken down by month and gender.

- Information on the number of clients identifying as Gender Diverse is included from December 2019
  on.
- To protect confidentiality the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- The data table has had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- A value of one or two may be rounded to zero or three.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.

In order to be eligible for Jobseeker Support, the applicant needs to be 18 years or older, therefore your request for data pertaining to Jobseeker Support recipients from age 16-18 is refused under under section 18(e) of the Act as this information does not exist or, despite reasonable efforts to locate it, cannot be found.

The Ministry do provide assistance to 16-17 year olds through the Youth Payment and to 16-19 year olds through the Young Parent Payment. These payments are provided to qualifying recipients, who are typically undertaking or available for full-time education or training.

If you are interested in data pertaining to individuals receiving Youth Payments and the Young Parent Payments, we encourage you to lodge a new request, and the Ministry will supply this information to you.

Your request for the specific area of Western Bay of Plenty District Council Katikati-Waihi Beach Ward, extending from Pahoia to Waihi Beach, with the Waipapa River being the Southern boundary is also refused under section 18(f) of the Act as the the lowest geographical boundary the Ministry reports on is by TLA. In order to provide you with this information Ministry staff would have to manually review thousands of files.

We welcome you to lodge a new request for the continued supply of this information as you require it. Your personal details will be deleted and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
