Dear

On 13 April 2021, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

• We base the rents / board we charge for the accommodation we provide on benefit levels to ensure it is affordable for the whānau we support. In the past we used the CPI data from Stats NZ, as benefits were indexed to the CPI. I have been in touch with Stats NZ and they are unable to provide the data you use to calculate the changes you make to benefits and superannuation (the net average wage). Can someone in your team direct me to where I can find this data so that we can make our biennial changes to rent/ board accordingly?

The Ministry uses the Net Average Ordinary Time Weekly Earnings figures to index main benefit payments. The Net Average Ordinary Time Weekly Earnings (AOTWE) figure is derived from Statistics New Zealand's Gross AOTWE data. The Ministry does this by calculating tax on the gross figure to produce the net figure, using standard M tax code rates and Accident Compensation Corporation earners levy as they apply on 1 April of each year.

Gross, net and percentage growth in AOTWE figures are in Table One below.

Table One: Gross, net and percentage growth in AOTWE figures, broken down by year

Please note that the gross AOTWE data comes from the Quarterly Employment Survey that Statistics NZ publishes as part of the quarterly Labour Market Statistics (HLFS) – see for example the December 2020 publication under Table 7 of the Quarterly Employment Survey spreadsheet at this link: https://www.stats.govt.nz/information-releases/labour-market-statistics-december-2020-quarter.
