On 12 October 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

*I* would be grateful if you could provide me some statistics on the social housing register.

Please can you provide a breakdown by ethnicity of applicants on the social housing register who have applied for housing in the Wellington region as at June 2022?

Please see the table below showing the number of applicants on the Social Housing Register<sup>1</sup> that have applied for housing in the Wellington Region<sup>2</sup> asat June 2022, broken down by ethnicity.<sup>3</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Ethnicity data is self-identified and multiple ethnicities may be chosen by an individual. Total response ethnicity means that if a person identifies with more than one ethnic group, they are counted in each applicable group. Because a client can choose more than one ethnic response, the total number of ethnic responses will be greater than the number of total distinct clients.

To protect confidentiality, the Ministry uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data. The above table has had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts. The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals. The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by publishing this letter on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.
