On 27 October 2022, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

I am trying to find statistics for tāngata whaikaha living on the Kāpiti coast, I have the numbers from the last census but was wondering if you had any statistics around the different benefits people are on, their ethnicities and age groups (I am not after names, just the numbers).

The Ministry sent a follow up email to you on 2 November 2022 seeking clarification on this request. That same day, you clarified your request by confirming the specific benefit types that represented the populations that you were interested in, in addition to confirming the date-ranges of interest.

Please see **Table One** in the **Appendix** showing the number of Kāpiti Coast based clients receiving the Jobseeker Health Condition and Disability benefit; and the Supported Living Payment Health Condition and Disability benefit from 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022, broken down by their recorded ethnicity(s).

Similarly, please see **Table Two** in the **Appendix** showing the number of Kāpiti Coast based clients receiving the Jobseeker Health Condition and Disability benefit; and the Supported Living Payment Health Condition and Disability benefit from 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022, broken down by age group.

The principles and purposes of the Official Information Act 1982 under which you made your request are:

- to create greater openness and transparency about the plans, work and activities of the Government,
- to increase the ability of the public to participate in the making and administration of our laws and policies and
- to lead to greater accountability in the conduct of public affairs.

This Ministry fully supports those principles and purposes. The Ministry therefore intends to make the information contained in this letter and any attached documents available to the wider public. The Ministry will do this by

publishing this letter on the Ministry's website. Your personal details will be deleted, and the Ministry will not publish any information that would identify you as the person who requested the information.

Jobseeker HC&D is Jobseeker Support Health Condition and Disability.

Supported Living Payment HC&D is Supported Living Payment Health Condition and Disability.

Territorial Local Authorities (TLA) are the second tier of local government in New Zealand, below regional councils.

TLA is estimated based on the client's address recorded by the Ministry of Social Development at the time period, the client may not necessarily reside in the same address at that time.

The table includes working age only (18 to 64 years).

Ethnicity data is self-identified and multiple ethnicities may be chosen by an individual as fits their preference or self-concept.

Total response ethnicity means that if a person identifies with more than one ethnic group, they are counted in each applicable group.

Because a client can choose more than one ethnic response, the total number of ethnic responses will be greater than the number of clients.

MELAA refers to Middle Eastern, Latin American, and African.

'Unspecified' is where ethnicity is not recorded. 'Other' is where ethnicities fall outside the reported ethnicities.

To protect confidentiality the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.

These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.

Random rounding does not round down to zero, a value of one or two will be rounded to three.

The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.

The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
