On 22 February 2023, you emailed the Ministry of Social Development (the Ministry) requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act), the following information:

• Because we are required to comment on equity issues in the health system, we need to be able to analyse data by ethnicity (location and ethnicity; gender and ethnicity; health condition and ethnicity, and so on). The way the data has been provided does not yet allow us to do that. Are you able to provide the data that will enable us to analyse for equity (ethnicity) issues, please? OR are we able to gain the raw data for the past 5 years (2018-2022) so we can analyse the data on our end?

At a broad level, we have provided you with data about current working age clients who were receiving the Job Seeker Benefit and who also experienced a health condition or disability between December 2018 to December 2022, broken down by ethnicity. At the more granular level, please see the two attached excel spreadsheets which contain the following data tables:
