- The Jobseeker Support related group includes Jobseeker Support Health Condition & Disability, Jobseeker Support Work Ready and Jobseeker Support Work Ready Training.
- The Supported Living Payment benefit group includes Supported Living Payment Carers and Supported Living Payment Health Condition and Disability.
- To protect confidentiality, the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- Random rounding does not round down to zero, a value of one or two will be rounded to three.

- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
