Official Information Act request

Thank you for your email of 4 February 2025, requesting information about overseas pensions that reduce entitlement to New Zealand Superannuation.

I have considered your request under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). Please find my decision on each part of your request set out below.

1. We would appreciate advice as to which overseas pensions reduce an entitlement to NZ Superannuation.

Most countries implement a social security legislation that offers pensions for retirement, disability, or the death of a partner.

As provided under sections 187-191 of the Social Security Act 2018, a client receiving an overseas pension will have their pension directly deducted from their New Zealand benefit or pension if that pension is:

- Part of a programme that provides benefits, pensions and periodical allowances for the same circumstances for which a New Zealand Benefit or pension would be made and
- Administered by or on behalf of the government of the overseas country.

2. Is there a list of these pensions – at least the most common ones?

Please find the attached **Appendix** which provides a list of overseas Pensions paid to clients on New Zealand Superannuation and Veteran's Pension which reduce entitlement to New Zealand Superannuation.

3. And specifically, would a UK NHS pension be affected?

An overseas pension is not subject to a direct deduction if it does not meet the criteria set out in the Social Security Act 2018. However, these pensions may still be treated as income for the purposes of income-tested assistance from the Ministry.

Pensions paid under the National Health Service Pension Scheme are generally not considered directly deductible. However, if someone has questions about a specific pension that they receive and how it affects their assistance from the Ministry, I encourage them to contact the Ministry's International Services team.
