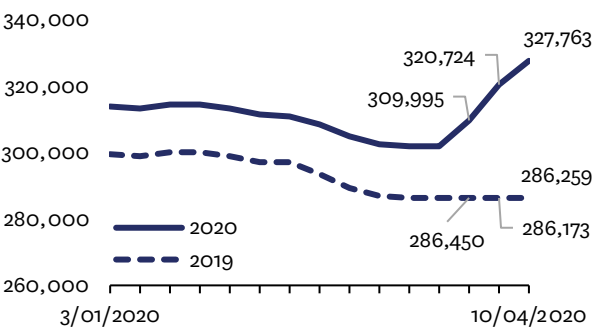

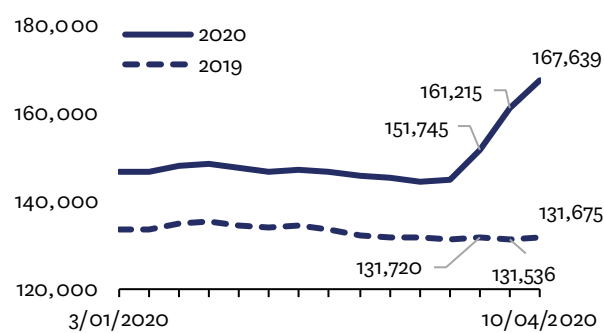

Main benefit numbers are working-age, those aged 18-64.

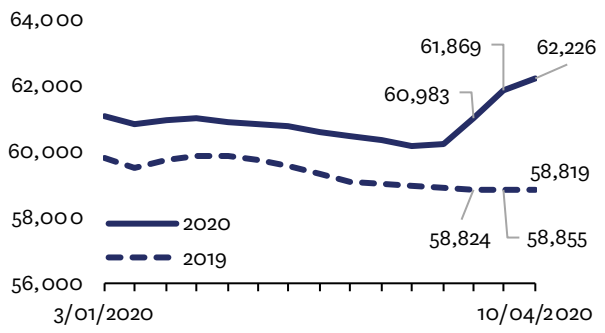
#### 1. Number of working-age people on a main benefit



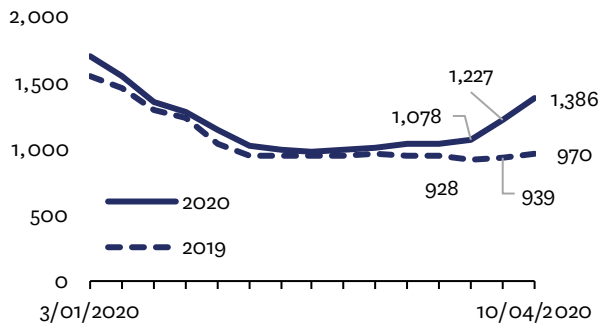
#### 2. Number of people receiving Jobseeker Support



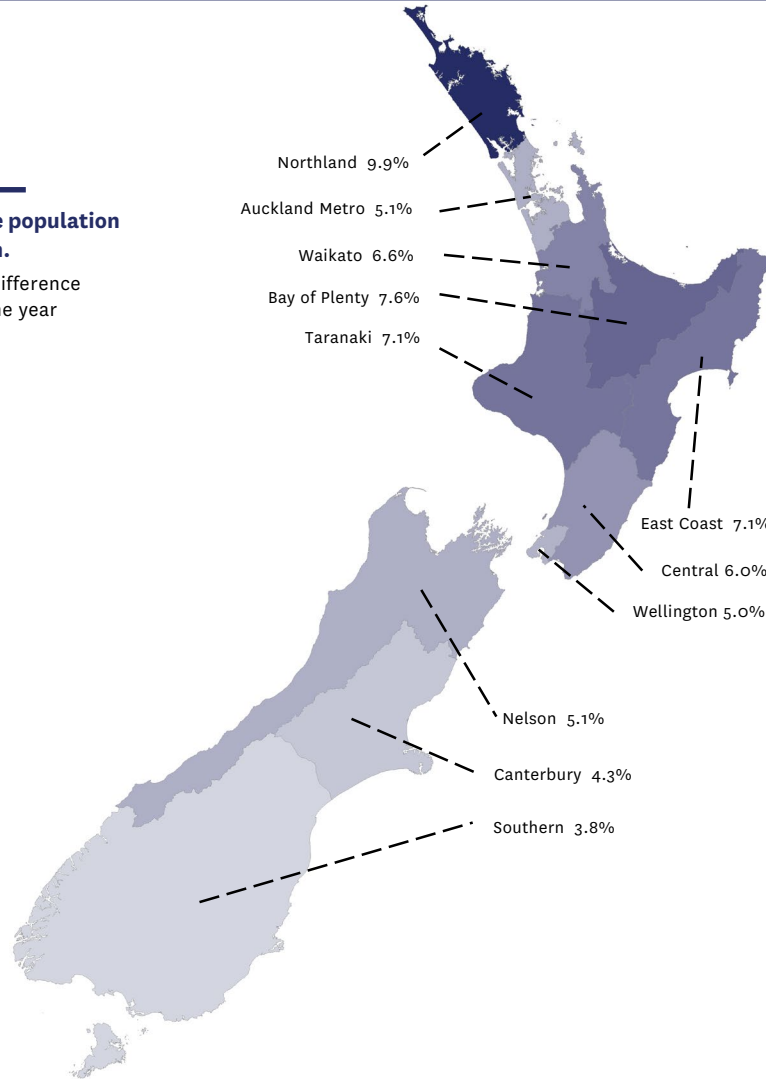
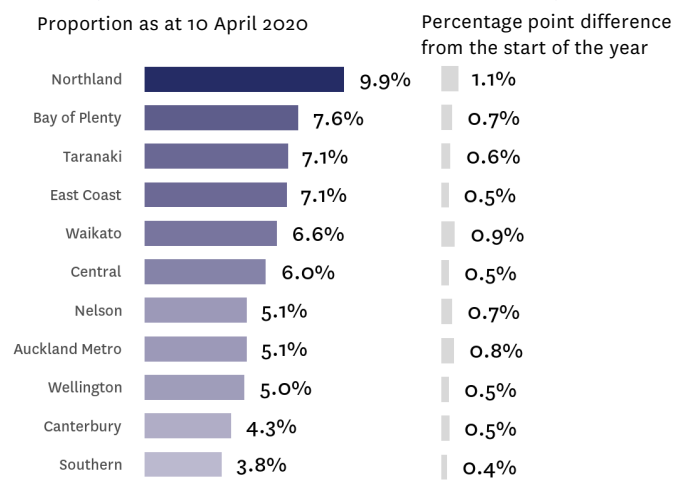
#### 3. Number of people receiving Sole Parent Support

### 5. Percentage of the estimated New Zealand working-age population receiving Jobseeker Support, by Work and Income region.

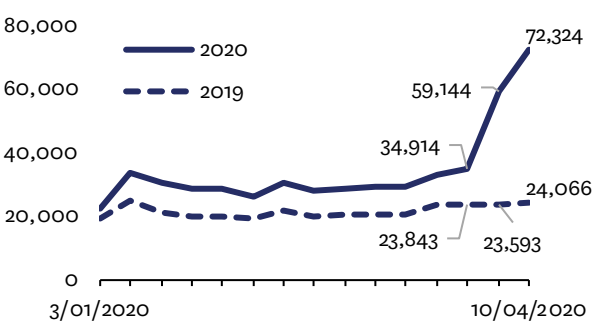


- For population proportions, the estimated resident New Zealand population aged 18-64 is used as at nearest June each year. Currently estimates as at June 2019 are used in this document.

- If Friday is a public holiday, variations in the data may occur as manual administrative actions may not occur on a public holiday.

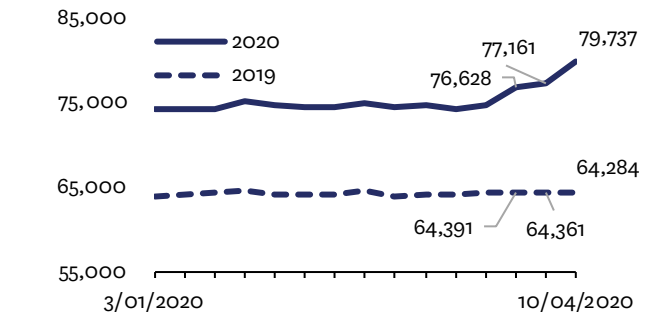
### Supplementary and hardship assistance

Hardship grants are counts of grants, rather than clients, one client can receive multiple grants.

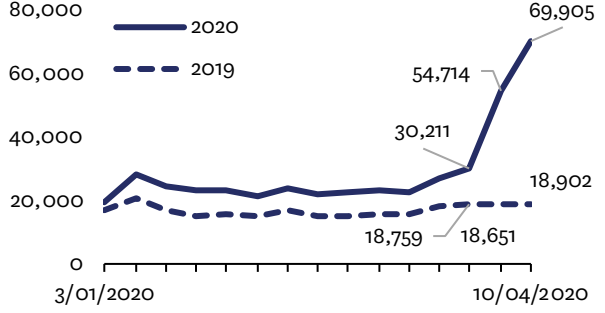
#### 6. Number of Special Need Grants during each week



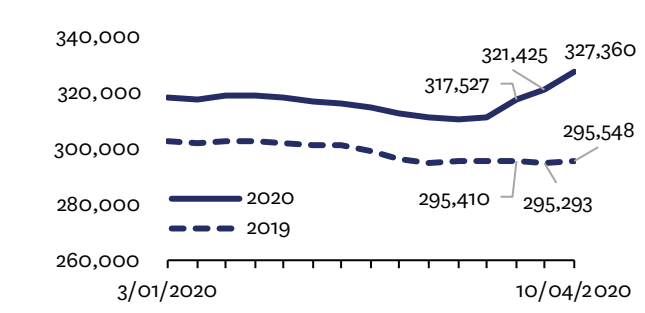
#### 7. Number of clients receiving Temporary Additional Support/Special Benefit



#### 8. Number of Special Need Grants for food during each week



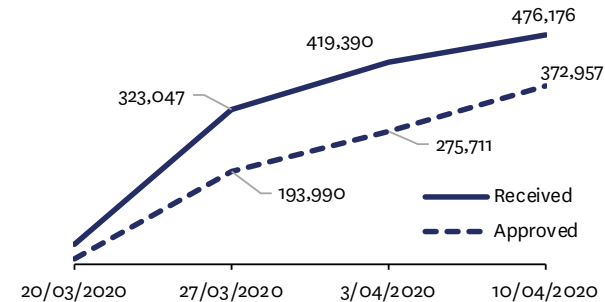
#### 9. Number of clients receiving Accommodation Supplement



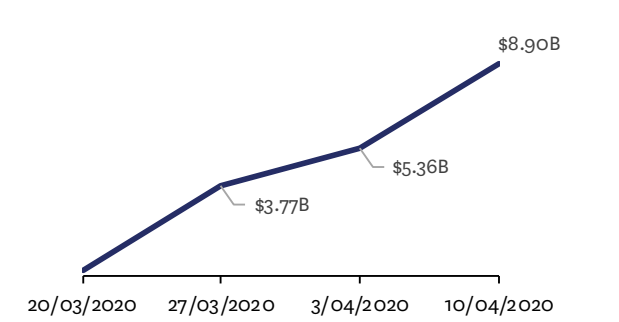
### Wage subsidy

Wage Subsidy data is cumulative data, sums over time. The data is loaded as at 2300 hours on Friday and is not available by region.

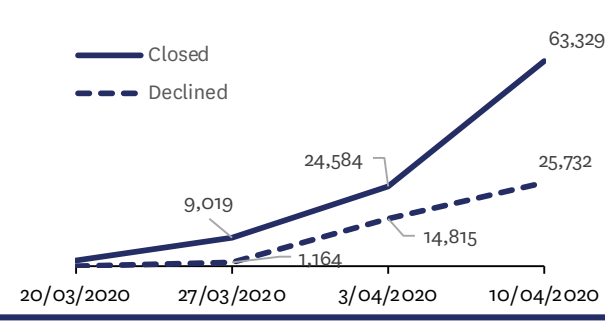
#### 10. Number of wage subsidy applications received and approved
