

Number of households in emergency housing - as at the end of each month




Commentary

The number of households in emergency housing (EH) has continued to decrease, reaching a total of 459 at the end of February 2025, down by 18 compared to the previous month. This is a significant drop from the same time last year, when the number of households in EH stood at 2,874, marking a 84% decrease.


Four regions observed a monthly decline in the number of households. Wellington recorded the largest decrease with 24 or 24% fewer households, followed by Auckland, Central and


















Social Housing Register | 28 Feb 2025 |

The Social Housing Register is a non-time bound list of all applicants eligible to be placed in social housing. Applicants complete a social housing assessment which determines eligibility and priority for social housing against an agreed set of criteria, which is then used to assist the social housing provider in matching to the most appropriate property.
















Percentage of main applicants, by ethnicity

Commentary

The number of applications on the Public Housing Register has decreased in February 2025, down by 225 compared to January 2025 or 6,234 compared to February 2024.

All regions except Auckland experienced a monthly decrease in applications with the highest decreases in Southern, down by 57 or 6%.

The number of applicants being housed from the Register has increased in February 2025. This follows the usual seasonal pattern for the beginning of each calendar year as more applicants are being housed following the holiday season.
